Choose the best pathway for you

Whether you are leaving school, returning to education as a mature student, or looking to gain additional qualifications to boost your career prospects, Fife College is here to help.

We have a wide range of higher education qualifications on offer at HNC and HND level. Plus we have over 600 different progression pathways with universities all across the country where you can choose to continue your studies to degree level.

Coming to study an HNC or HND with us has a number of benefits:

→ Flexible

One of the main benefits of a college education is its flexibility. We have a wide variety of learning options which allow you to combine your studies with work or family life, including part-time study; online and distance learning; and even some courses that offer evening or weekend options. And the best thing is, you can take your studies one year at a time, gaining a recognised qualification for each year of study you complete, before deciding what option you choose next.

→ Local

Traditionally, Higher Education (HE) qualifications meant having to go away to university, with all the cost and upheaval this might bring. However, we can offer you an alternative path. For those who don't want to relocate to university due to financial or family commitments, this makes your local college a great alternative option.

→ Affordable

With the ongoing cost of living crisis, studying at your local college could be a great way of cutting down on ever-increasing travel and accommodation expenses that might make studying elsewhere too expensive. There are also opportunities to apply for funding to help with course fees and other living costs, as well as a generous range of scholarship options available via our Adam Smith scholarship scheme.

Degrees: An alternative pathway

Many people still believe that studying towards a degree means having to move away to university and committing the next three or four years to studying in a different city, with all the financial and family implications that entails.

However, you can choose the same path as an increasing number of students, and start your degree studies right here in Fife. You can study for an HNC (the equivalent of a first year of a university degree); an HND (the equivalent of second year at university); then choose to complete a full degree in as little as one further year, either via one of our partnership agreements with universities across the country, or directly through one of the nine degree courses fully available on a Fife College campus.

We're proud to offer over 600 defined routes to degree courses, allowing local students to start their degree closer to home. Another major benefit of studying your higher education qualifications with Fife College.


- 1** No need to commit to four years of study at university – at college, you can take each year at a time.

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Starting your qualifications at school



Did you know you can study a college course as part of your timetable while you are still at school?

All of our courses are designed to help you develop skills needed for both Higher Education and employment, and allow you to be an independent, self-motivated and creative critical thinker.

School College Partnership

You don't have to wait until you finish school to start thinking about what you want to do afterwards. You can start your pathway to a degree at school through Higher National Certificate (HNC) courses which are offered through our School College Partnership and are the equivalent of year 1 of a university degree.

In many cases, it means you can study on campus where you'll experience college life and learn new skills in our state-of-the-art facilities.

All our courses are chosen to allow you to move on to a degree course either at Fife College or with one of our university partners so you get the skills you really need for your future career.

What if I don't have the entry qualifications required for an HNC or HND course?

We do have another option for you.

If you are an adult with few or no formal qualifications, and who has been out of full-time education for at least three years (or five, if you have existing qualifications at SCQF level 5), Fife College offers courses which are specifically designed to help you back into education.

Through our partnership with the Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP), these courses allow you – in a single year – to gain the qualifications required to progress to an HNC, HND or year 1 of a degree at university.

Progressing from college to university

Fife College offers over 600 routes to degree programmes in partnership with a wide range of universities across Scotland and the UK.

You will usually see these referred to as an Articulation Route. This is a pathway between a full-time higher national course, such as an HNC or HND, and a degree course, which has been formally agreed between the College and a university.

These routes are reviewed annually by each university and the College to make sure that the content of your HN course aligns to the content of the first year (or first two years) of your chosen degree to ensure a smooth transition to degree study.

If an articulation route is in place, it means that you could get direct entry onto a degree course - with an HNC you could get direct entry to year 2 at university, and with an HND you could move straight to year 3.

Whilst you are studying on your HN course at Fife College you may have the opportunity to meet staff from several of our partner universities and colleges.

Staff from these partner institutions will offer you the chance to participate in workshops that will let you gain skills to help you with degree level study. These sessions will either be built into your programme of study or offered as additional workshops; they will help to make your transition to university smoother by ensuring that you have the necessary skills to join a degree course in year 2 or 3.

Studying for your full university degree at Fife College

Once you have successfully achieved your HND, in some subjects we offer the option to complete your full degree with us here at Fife College.

This is called a Franchise or Validated Degree, and they allow you to study for your full university-awarded degree at a Fife College campus. This means you can keep all your costs down, but also benefit from using partner university facilities like libraries, open days and even some lectures, and you'll get a fully accredited Ordinary or Honours degree awarded by the university at the end of your studies.

The following franchise degree opportunities are currently available at Fife College:

In partnership with Abertay University:

- BA Accounting with Finance
- BA Business Management
- BA Inclusion and Support in Society
- BA (Hons) Inclusion and Support in Society

We also offer degrees which are validated by Queen Margaret University:

- BA Creative Enterprise
(This degree allows progression from 12 different HNDs. See the website for more details.)
- BA Childhood Studies
- BA (Hons) Childhood Studies
- BA Childhood Practice (*part-time study degree for SSSC-registered practitioners with at least two years' experience of working within an Early Learning and Childcare setting*)

Plus if you have successfully completed HND Social Sciences at Fife College you also have the option to study your third year on campus for the following Open University degree:

- BA (Hons) Social Sciences*

* This degree follows the English model and allows an Honours degree to be completed in one year following successful completion of your HND.

Qualifications explained

All you need to know about qualifications and how they work together.

Like all Scottish colleges and universities, we use the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) levels to describe our courses.

It shows how you can build up credits to gain the qualification you want; transfer credits onto other courses; and compare levels across different courses and qualifications.

Remember - there's no one set or right way to progress through school, college, university and into the job you want. And one of the benefits of college is how flexible your route can be, with so many options available to suit your own circumstances. You can even take time out of your studies and pick them up again at a later stage.

Higher Education (HE) Qualifications Explained

Higher National Certificates (HNC)

SCQF Level 7 – the equivalent to year 1 at university

HNCs are normally completed in one year full-time or in two years with part-time study. Upon successful completion of an HNC, you have options which may include progressing to an HND at Fife College, or a degree with one of our partner universities (often entering the degree course in year 2), or employment.

Higher National Diplomas (HND)

SCQF Level 8 – the equivalent to year 2 at university

An HND is two years of study if done as a full-time course. If you're progressing from HNC, you will go straight into the second and final year of the HND. They give you the option of progressing through to a degree (often entering year 3 of the degree course) or employment.

Degrees

SCQF Levels 9 (Degree) and 10 (Honours Degree)

We have over 600 routes to a wide range of degree courses at other institutions, with the benefit of studying the first one or two years locally. And working alongside our partner universities, we also offer a great range of degrees right on your doorstep at Fife College campuses, so that you can study your whole degree at Fife College. These degrees are awarded by our university partners so are the same as those issued to their own students.




